Organizational Structure: 14 member board of directors with officer positions for president, vice president, treasurer/membership, and secretary. There are committees for early detection/early response, education/outreach and web site updates, invasive plant mapping data coordination, Chinese Privet control task force, Kudzu control task force, and SC non-native invasive species plant list.

Synopsis: SC-EPPC serves to provide a focus for and facilitates communication regarding issues and concerns related to invasive plants in South Carolina. South Carolina EPPC provides a forum where all interested parties may participate in meetings and promotes public understanding regarding invasive plants and their control. They serve as an advisory Council regarding funding, research, management, and control of invasive plants, and facilitate action campaigns to monitor and control invasive plants.
